- 1** A healthy relationship with the natural environment, during both construction and operation.
- 2** Creating a place where people feel comfortable, healthy and inspired.
- 3** Net Zero Energy, which means we will generate as much energy as we use.
- 4** Using 50% less energy than similar facilities.
- 5** Using 50% less water than similar facilities.
- 6** Generating minimal waste during construction and operation.

We hope Camp Glenorchy will serve as an example of sustainability in everything we do, inspiring visitors to bring some of these ideas back to their own homes and communities.



LIVING BUILDING CHALLENGE™



The LBC is made up of seven categories or 'petals' each with its own aims.

Camp Glenorchy is being designed, built and operated in line with the philosophy and principles of the Living Building Challenge (LBC).

The LBC has been recognised as the **most stringent environmental building design certification in the world**. It aims to transform how we plan for design and construction in order to enhance and contribute to the natural environment and the cultural fabric of our human communities.

As Camp Glenorchy comes to life, we will share information about the choices we're making that relate to each of the LBC Petals.

Once Camp Glenorchy is open for business, we will also publicly share the sustainability data we're measuring, to show how we're performing against a Net Zero Energy target.
