1 GLENORCHY

The intimate, respectful relationship that the local community has with their surroundings will be honoured in our sustainable approach to both building design and the land, echoing Glenorchy's story as well as its beautiful setting.

2 ELECTRIC VEHICLES

We support people choosing to minimise their impact on our environment.

To encourage this, we are installing electric car charging stations powered by electricity generated in our solar garden. We'll be using electric utility vehicles and plug-in hybrids in our operations, to reduce our need for fossil fuels by using the energy we generate ourselves. And bicycles will be available to our guests to allow them to explore the area without using fossil fuel!

3 DESIGN FOR RESILIENCE

Resiliency refers to the ability to meet the challenges of the future.

It also represents the capacity to recover in the event of a natural disaster. Camp Glenorchy is designed to serve as a Civil Defence resource for the community, providing a place of safety and security in case of a natural disaster.

4 LANDSCAPING

Camp Glenorchy's native plant landscape will reflect local geology, vegetation and culture.

Our objective is to create both indoor and outdoor spaces that will educate, delight and inspire visitors, blend with the surroundings, and create safe, healthy habitats for native flora and fauna.
