## **Creativity Abounds!**

Glenorchy artist Dan Kelly has begun to erect the Scheelite Campfire Shelter at Camp Glenorchy. It's being built from huge ancient stones, recycled Jarrah timbers, and historic mining equipment from around the area. When complete it will serve as the primary outdoor gathering place, serving also as a functioning BBQ and dining area. A kinetic water sculpture—inspired by the historic water-driven ore battery stamper



once located at Mount Judah—will collect and store rainwater which will eventually be used on the native plant landscape. Dan said about the design, "If you drive and hike around the local district, you will likely come across old stone ruins that are often stone fireplaces. The fireplace was the heart and soul of these houses: settlers used the fireplace to generate warmth and cook meals for their family."



In mid-January, visiting stone mosaic artist Jeffrey Bale and Auckland-based community artist Caroline Robinson will be coming to town to meet with the community to dream up the initial ideas for the braided river stone mosaic walkway that will lead from Mrs Woolly's General Store to the Scheelite Campfire Shelter at Camp Glenorchy. They will be gathering ideas, input, stones and stories over the next few years to weave into the design for the pathway through the campground. Some of you may have seen Jeffrey's initial stone "sketches" for the walkway near Mrs Woolly's

General Store: Caroline and he will be inviting you to bring some of your own ideas to the prototyping they'll be doing onsite during the year ahead.

## **New Lightweight Camper Trailers**

Starting on 10 January, Mrs Woolly's Campground will feature overnight accommodations in **two new NASA-inspired camper-trailers**. Light enough to be towed behind a small car instead of an SUV, these aerodynamic wonders each contain a V-berth bed, lounge, picture window, off-grid power and a solar-rechargeable battery that can replenish itself. Mrs Woolly's General Store is the first dealer in New Zealand for Taxa Outdoor's state-of-the-art, go-anywhere escape pods which we'll be selling as well as renting out at the campground. Stop by anytime to see the future of self-contained adventuring!
